

Canon Jim Rosenthal, 60, who processes through the streets of Canterbury each December as the real St Nicholas, will be installed as Parish Priest at St Nicholas at Wade Church, Thanet, this Saturday (21 January). The highly successful Nicholasfest by now in its 12th year, included the Archbishop of Canterbury and the Bishop of Dover walking along St Nicholas.

Canon Rosenthal is the founder of the St Nicholas Society UK/USA, which attempts to teach people who Santa Claus really is, and appears in many churches and events over the Advent. Furthermore, he is a very special person also for those who are interested in the spreading of Nicholas' cult throughout the world. In fact if you go on Internet and click for "stnicholascenter ... church Gazetteer" you will find the entire world ordained according the continents and the states, with a rich list of St Nicholas Churches for each country. The fact of having the image of the Church helps avoiding confusion. The worth of his list is also in clarifying the Christian confession to which that Church belongs.



Thanks to the cooperation of **Mrs Carol Myers, the** Center founded by Rosenthal has a very active American network, with which the Centro Studi Nicolaiani of Bari is in continuous contact.

Almost every year he comes to Bari and is a special guest of our Dominican Community of St Nicholas' Basilica. That's why he made many Barian friends and foreigners who equally love St Nicholas.

He lived for 7 years at Old Palace Canterbury during the time of Lord Carey when he served as Communications Officer for the Anglican Communion. "Kent is like a homecoming and I can't wait to start," he said. He says the smiles he brings to the faces of "thousands" each year keep him happy and well for the whole year.

The welcome service is on Saturday, 21 January 2012 at 3 p.m at St Nicholas at Wade. Leading the service will be Bishop in Canterbury Trevor Willmott, Archdeacon Sheila Watson and Priest in Charge Bob Coles of Minster. The Dean of the Cathedral is also expected to attend.

Originally from Chicago, Fr Rosen- thal has served churches in London including St Matthews, Westminster, All Hallows by the Tower, St Stephen Walbrook and St Marylebone Parish Church. He is honorary canon of 3 cathedrals and serves as communications specialist for the Awareness Foundation in London of which the Archbishop of Canterbury is patron.

Fr Rosenthal is "thrilled to come **back to the Canterbury** diocese and especially to St Nicholas at Wade and Chislet". He will celebrate Holy Communion and Preach for the first time in his new role on 22 January at 10.15 a.m. in St Nicholas at Wade.



St Nicholas at Wade Parish

St Nicholas at Wade, more commonly simply **St Nicholas,** part of the Wantsum Group, is a both a village and a <u>civil parish</u> in the <u>Thanet District</u> of <u>Kent, England</u>. The parish had a recorded population of 782 at the <u>2001 Census</u>. The village of <u>Sarre</u> is part of the civil parish.

The name derives from its location on the western border of the Isle of Thanet (originally separated from the mainland). Before the channels of the River Wantsum and River Stour silted up, one would have been able to 'wade' at this point, over a ford. In Roman times the channel was navigable and the site likely very busy with the Saxon Shore Forts of Regulbium (Reculver) and Rutupiae (Richborough) by. Remains of Roman both close shipbuilding yards are said to have been found between St. Nicholas-at-Wade and the nearby village of Sarre.

THE 600 ST NICHOLAS' CHURCHES IN THE UNITED KINGDOM

St Nicholas Churches in England keep all the magic of the powerful Middle Age buildings as it happens in no other country of the world. Certainly in Italy, France, Germany and Russia too there are many beautiful St Nicholas' churches, but a great number of them underwent heavy modernizations. On the contrary, if you look at the English St Nicholas' churches you feel transported back to the age of William the Conqueror or Richard Lion's Heart.

A great number of St Nicholas' Parishes are very active. When I accompanied Princes Charles and Diana visiting our Basilica in Bari (2 of May 1985), I published a special issue of the *Bollettino di S. Nicola* and sent it to many Anglican Parishes. In that occasion I received in response a lot of letters and booklets from them.

A characteristic of the English Parishes (and in general of the Protestant St Nicholas' Parishes) is the **ecumenical spirit**. Almost all of them in the Internet presentation are very warmly inviting to join them in the prayer and in the dialogue, regardless of your Christian denomination. An example that, in my opinion, should be followed by the Roman Catholics and the Orthodox.

The following list of 611 St Nicholas' Churches is an updating of what I published together with **Philip Barnes** in the year

1994 (based mainly on the *Studies in Church Dedications* by **Frances Arnold Foster**). At that time I had notice of 428 St Nicholas Churches. Afterwards I took into account that extraordinary work by can. Jim Rosenthal named « **St Nicholas Society** ... **Churches Gazetteer** » (very useful

because of the images and because of the informations about the Christian denomination that takes care of the Church). The third source is connected with the **hundreds of sites** realized by people concerned with churches and monuments in England, and that are dayly growing on **Internet.** Although I did not finish carrying out cheks, I prefer to draw up a provisional list anyway (so that if someone finds out mistakes could make me the favor of bringing it to my attention).

As for the chapels, I have included only the chapels in the meaning of **small churches**, omitting the chapels inside Cathedrals or other churches. I could not always check wether the chapels annexed to the many **St Nicholas Primary Schools** were real little churches or rather rooms adapted for prayer. For the moment all these St Nicholas' chapels have been omitted.

The list is made according to the counties in their alphabetical order.
