





























1. HAIL, O SHINING NICHOLAS Salve, o Nicola fulgido

Hail, o shining Nicholas our defence and glory, Thanks to you Bari lights up with new light and magic, and proclaims you its heavenly protector.

Refrain:

To you we raise our song of praise, glory and love.

You who were defender of faith and victorious preacher, you pointed out Christ as God's son and Lord, preserve our faith, free of every error.

To you we raise ...

The charity that is the core of the Goodness without end, make live in our hearts, let kindle in our life. You who to the poor were relief in his sorrow.

To you we raise ...

Of virtue you were a marvelous defender, saving the honor of the three virgins, look at the youth and protect its innocence.

To you we raise ...

Merciful rescuer of sailors, be light in the darkness of this stormy world, and lead us to the port of the true life.

To you we raise ...

The secret sufferings of your humble life are for your children shining examples of penance.

Please give us this spirit and the zeal.

To you we raise ...

Your blessed bones pour the holy manna. If to it run the weak and the poor, he shall obtain the flower of your graces, a pledge of your friendship.

To you we raise ...

You the mystic Orient lead to the true holiness, uniting it in a link of faith and thought with the eternal Rome in the embrace of its motherly heart.

To you we raise ...

Please look mercifully at your children, wipe their tears and save them from all dangers, rekindle in the spirits the faith, the hope, the love.

To you we raise ...

NB. This hymn is very frequently performed in the liturgical celebrations in honor of St Nicholas. Its composer was Don Cesare Franco (Acquaviva delle Fonti 1885-1944), who succeeded in 1912 to Pasquale La Rotella as Master of Chapel in the Basilica of St Nicholas. Here he remained about 25 years. The most important of his (about 100) compositions is probably the *Oratorio di San Nicola*.

2. SI QUAERIS MIRACULA

IF YOU LOOK FOR MIRACLES

This is a medieval hymn of the XIII century. The beginning is very close to an hymn in honor of St Anthony of Padua. The stanza "O pavor Arii" is not attested in the editions before the second half of the XIX century. It is not easy to say whether its origin is French or Italian.

If you look for miracles,

the blind see and the cripple walk, and St Nicholas' bones pour the holy manna.

The dangers finish, tempests calm down, let speak so the sailors.

Adeodatus is given back to the father, the Agarens are surprised. Three virgins are comforted, let speak so the people of Patara.

You, beloved land, the sacred bones you received as a pledge, you preserve for all the peoples who come from far away, o happy Bari.

The sailors who invoke you, you are ready to help, and the seas calm down, with your Interceding you with the holy Virgin.

You intercede with God in the labor pains of the mothers who invoke you. To everybody your holy manna be pledge of health and salvation.

[O terror of Arius, victorious over the heresies, liberator of the army officials, protector of three young people, O Nicholas, you who are so powerful and influent, beseech graces for us in need].

Let us be all liberated from the dangers, from the wars and from the hunger, o glorious St Nicholas, great father. Amen.

Glory to the Father, to the Son, and to the holy Spirit. The dangers disappear, the tempests calm down, let the sailors say so.

3. PLEASE, COME O POWERFUL PASTOR OF MYRA Deh vieni, o potente Pastore di Mira.

4. ST NICHOLAS GOES ACROSS THE SEAS Sanda Necole va pe mare

This song is not sung during the liturgical celebrations, but is the most popular in Barian *dialect*. Its origin is uncertain, although has often been published (for example by Alfredo Giovine in *Canti popolari religiosi baresi*, Bari 1963).

St Nicholas walk on the seas, dressed like a sailor, he loves pilgrims from the mountain, St Nicholas is all of gold.

Be happy o pilgrims, St Nicholas is leaving, be happy o sailors, he goes across the seas.

St Nicholas is all of silver, on the sea gives favorable wind, on the earth gives the sunshine. St Nicholas is all of gold.

Be happy o pilgrims, etc.
