"Stop here for a moment, o pilgrim, and enter to pray. Wayfarer take a rest, and then you go on walking. [...] You already saw and knew this monastery ? Do you know that its name is written in golden letters in our history ? When you meet the events of the year 1821, no place is more famous and glorious than this one.

These words are addressed to the Greek visitor in a little guide booklet. They suggest prayer, but also a feeling of patriotic pride. It was here in fact that March 25 1821 started the Greek independence against the Turkish rule.




THE MONASTERY OF ST NICHOLAS KALTEZON THE ORIGINS

The monastery is in the province of Mantinea, in the Arcadia region (central Peloponnesus), about 30 km from Tripolis and two and a half from Kaltezés, the village from which it borrows the name (in the local dialect "wells").

Surrounded by secular oaks at the center of plains defended by mountains, the monastery of St Nicholas Kaltezon looks like a fortress, as it happens with other monasteries in Arcadia and in other Greek regions.


That's why it became famous after that March 25 of the year 1821 when the Greek people revolted against Turkish domination regaining its independence.

Bookmark of a little book published by the monastery and edited by the nun Ekaterini (secular name Kannèllou Eutichia; graduated in Medicine in Bologna/Italy and member of the "Association of Herbal Medicine and Therapy", Siena University. The booklet gives informations on therapeutical properties of 17 plants, 21 prescriptions against cholesterol, fat and triglycerides. Today the Monastery is a peaceful place, with only a few nuns. What makes it interesting ? Let's start with a few words about the origins, that already reveal a fight for the faith and explains the St Nicholas connection.

There are two main popular traditions. The first one is based on the figure of the monk Ananias, who is mentioned in an inscription of the main entrance. According to this traditions around the half of 17th century a certain Elias Lyronis emigrated from Kaltezes with his brother in the hope of finding some job. Once in Smyrne, he was about to get married, but, because of some St Nicholas' apparitions he delayed the marriage. The Saint wanted that he would go back to Kaltezes and dig near a chapel that he would have indicated to him. There he would have found an icon of the Saint, and because of it would have built a monastery. Elias obeyed to the Saint. Back to Kaltezes he found the icon and sailed again to Smyrne to build the monastery. The Saint however stopped the ship and he had to go back to Kaltezes.

Here he collected the money for the construction of the monastery. At beginning he was able to build only a cell for him and a little church to the Saint. Inside the little church he put the icon and before it a burning lamp. As monk he took the name of Ananias.

He conducted a saintly life, in prayer and sacrifices. Even today he is remembered by the local people like the Saint Father («Αγιοπατέρας»).

But the Saint's deeds did not stop here. While building the monastery, once Ananias complained with St Nicholas, because the Turk Agàs who ruled over the country did not refrain from plundering the monastery and damaging his work.

With an extraordinary intervention the Saint stopped the Agàs.

In Greek “Ayas” (in Turkish *agha* or *ağa*) was a dignity of the Ottoman Empire, a prince or administrator, or representative of the Sultan. In Neo-Greek the term designates an arrogant or despotic person, or sometimes a person with no financial problems.






THE REVIVAL

Another tradition dates back the origin of the monastery some 70 years later, and precisely to April 22 of the year 1722.

Saint Nicholas appeared to the Agàs, floored him and immobilized him to the ground. In strong confusion the Agàs asked pardon, promising not only to stop plundering but also to give compensation for the damages caused by him. From that moment on he brought gifts to the monastery and donated the oil for the lamp before the icon.

People say that afterwards no other Turkish ruler ventured to harass the monk's life. This victory signed forever the spirit of the fighting life of this monastery. As we shall see from the facts.



In the transition period from a rule to the other the monastery underwent serious devastations and destructions. Therefore, the reconstruction changed very much of its architectural shape. It was a refoundation, rather than a restoration.

New cells were built and, on the ruins of the previous katholikòn, a new central St Nicholas church was constructed.

Slowly the number of the monks increased, till about twenty. Thanks to many donations they could go on with the works until their accomplishment in the year 1795, the date to which refers the inscription we talked about.

This inscription mentions the rule of Selim III, who was the Sultan of the Ottoman Empire between 1789 and 1807.

Here it is the text of the inscription:

THIS MONASTERY THAT IS CALLED
SAINT NICHOLAS KALTEZON
WAS BUILT DURING THE REIGN OF SELIM III,
WITH THE CONTRIBUTIONS OF THE
HIGOÙMENOS MONK K. ANANIAS,
OF KOME RUMANI AND KALTEZES,
FOR THE SALVATION OF THE SOUL,
AND THE REST OF THE FATHERS WHO WOULD COME
AFTERWARDS

THE YEAR OF THE SALVATION
1795

From that date till the years of the insurrection the monastery reached a degree of great activity and economic affluence.

It were constructed at this time waterworks for the comfort of the community.

Like in other monasteries it was created the so called «**kryfò scholeiò**», an underground school for children and young people who, bypassing the prohibitions of the occupying Turkish forces, went across a **secret passage** to the monastery.

Here the monks taught them reading and writing in Greek, as well as the first elements of the culture and of the Christian faith.


This way the essential elements of the **Greek people identity** were perpetuated.



STRATEGIC CENTER *OF THE* INSURRECTION

And now, it is time to speak of the heroic phase in the history of St Nicholas monastery. In May 1819 here takes place an absolutely secret and confidential meeting of local authorities and armed people. The discussion goes on the way to free the Greek people from the Turkish domination. The place of the encounter, in which nothing was decided, was a very little cell (3 x 5 meters) that exists even today in the south western side of the monastery.

With the insurrection of the “Twenty one” the monastery lives its epic moment, emerging as the strategic center of the fight. Even the monks take the arms and are burning with patriotic zeal. Captains and revolt leaders like the famous general **Theòdoros Kolokothronis**, and politicians like Petrobèis Mavromichàlis and bishops of the Orthodox Church choose St Nicholas monastery of Kaltezés as the ideal place to organize the revolt strategies.



Thirty seven representatives of the various Greek provinces, headed by Petrobèis, met there several times and within a few days elected 6 senators: Petrobeis, Theodòretos, bishop of Vrèsthena, S. Charalàmpis, Th. Chànaris, A. Delighiànnis, and with the office of secretary Rigas Palamìdis).



May 26 1821 is put on record the act of constitution of the historical Peloponnesian Senate (**Πελοπονησιακή Γερουσία**). The manuscript with the official act starting with the word **Patrìs (Homeland)**, with the signatures of all the members is even today exhibited in the Museum of the Monastery (see here, page 9).

This senate composed by six members becomes the main plank of the first governmental organism entrusted with the organization of war actions in the entire country. It is decided also that the next meeting shall be in Stemnìtsa. June the first in the monastery is signed the first official communication addressed to all the prefects and important figures of the Peloponnesus.


The crucial moment comes in february 1825, when the general Ibrahim disembarks to Peloponnesus to bring reinforcements to the Turks. He heads an Egyptian army with 35.000 soldiers. He is well known for his ability

in using new war methods [see Appendix, page 11]

After conquering Tripolis, he attacks the St Nicholas monastery of Kaltezés, besieging it with his powerful artillery. The monks oppose an heroic defense, but the bombs cause a dangerous fire that destroys the cells of the northern side with precious objects and the archives.

After this heroic deed the monastery with its few surviving monks undergoes a period of crisis. However, it is always employed as shelter for the Greek population and especially for those engaged in the fight for the independence. Many of them can escape to the Turks by reaching the monastery through a secret tunnel (still existing) that leads to the southern western side of the construction.

The king **Otto I of Bavaria**, who has come to Greece to take the role of sovereign guarantor of the liberated country, at first recognizes the merits of the monastery declaring it "historical monument" (decree of January 20, 1838), but afterwards suppresses it together with all small monasteries (February 25, 1846). St Nicholas becomes a **metochion** and is joined to the monastery of *Panaghia Gorgoepikoos* of **Tsipianà** (Arcadia).



For many years the monastery is remembered only for its patriotic moment in the books of history.



FEMALE AUTONOMOUS MONASTERY

But, "if holy is the root, holy shall be equally the branches" (*Rom 11,16*). St Nicholas presence after that icon discovering, the charisma of the monk Ananias who, guided by the Saint, finds the icon and his vocation, and the heroic witness of the monks of the "21" for the conquest of the freedom of the country, are all signs that no decree can cancel. From the roots reappear new saintly branches.





The revival of the monastery after 1921 (almost 80 years after the suppression) is due to nuns of great personalities who repopulated the monastery. As soon as the monastery has gained again its autonomy, thanks to the nun **Magdalini** among those ruined walls resound the tolls of the bells and with the wooden "simandro" the people are called to prayer. Afterwards, comes the higoumèni **Agape-Athinà**, native of Konoditza (near Sparta). Like a real Sparta woman she works in order to bring back the community to a regular coenobitical life. In the year 1925 a nun, **Eufemia**, creates a professional school for the girls of the region, and so the monastery becomes a laboratory of humanity. Moments of prayer alternated with moments of work and of study, a rhythm that helps the girls to discover their capacities and talents. We have more than once visited this monastery with its typically womanly atmosphere: flowers and gardens together with order and beauty.

The inside walls of the *katholikòn*, and other spaces of the monastery have been frescoed by the nun **Elèni Kyriazi**. Although she has followed the canons of the Byzantine iconography, the visitor



can notice a style somehow naive, vivid, expressive, not deprived of genius.

At the moment there are two elderly sisters and one about fifty years old, native of Focides. This latter, **Ekaterini**, graduated in Medicine, speaks various languages (fluently Italian). Dynamic and openminded, she lives in full harmony with the elderly sisters. She tries to draw the attention of the civil authorities of Kaltezés municipality and Mantinea province about the needs of the monastery. She would like to see the monastery restored with their contribution and the creation of an historical artistic museum with a parking for the visitors, a library and a page web (<http://www.monikaltezon.gr>) for a dialogue with the faithful, the pilgrims and the friends of the community.

She has received us, Dominican brothers of the Basilica of St Nicholas in Bari, with a smile, asking us to feel at home. About herself she affected says: "*I was like Elias Lyronis, searching for a place where to live my vocation. Like him, who after finding the icon dedicated himself to St Nicholas, me too I have found my road. St Nicholas wanted me to be here, and I have put*

myself completely to his service. Please, send from Bari everything that could help to know better our Saint. He is a father and a friend.

There is no spiritual or material need presented to him that remains unanswered. On the contrary, he goes beyond our expectations.



OTHER ST NICHOLAS MONASTERIES IN THE METROPOLYA OF MANTINEA






2. Diptychs.


In the late antiquity this word designated an object for writing, consisting in two equal valves that could be closed. The inner sides were spread with wax on which were carved graphic signs. At first they were used for school exercises, from the IV century became the official way to register promotions in political and social life as well as offices and imperial decrees. Related to christian liturgy they were used mainly to mention living members of the community, deceased members, the preceding bishops. In this third category were inserted the names of the Saints mostly venerated by the local community.

On this subject a research was conducted as License degree in the Institute of Ecumenical Patristic Theology San Nicola in Bari: P. FRISONE I dittici liturgici dal III al XI secolo, academic year 2006-2007.

3. TINOS

“In Tinos, besides our Parish church in the city (Chòra) there are other 15 churches, mainly rural chapels (εξωκκλήσια). It is interesting that many of these churches and chapels are located near springs and wells from which to take water in order to irrigate the fields and furnish the villages. This justifies the conjecture that St Nicholas was considered the protector not only of the seas, but of rivers, springs and wells too; something like the similar cult reserved by the ancient Greeks to Poseidon” (from a message of February the third 2014 on <https://it-mg42.mail.yahoo.com>).

4. Ibrahim. A general of the Turkish army, Ibrahim was born in 1789 in Kavàla (Greece), may be from a christian mother and Turkish father. Sent by the father to help the Ottoman forces against the Greek insurrection, he came in 1824. After some victories he was defeated several times. Finally, at Navarrino his fleet was destroyed. In 1828 he started his withdrawal, during which he burned the fields and caused serious damages to villages and monasteries. In his last years he entered in contrast with the Ottoman high authorities, and died of tuberculosis at Cairo in the month of November of the year 1848.

**ST NICHOLAS MONASTERY

In Greece, a book in full view in the choir or in the sacristy of an orthodox church is the ecclesiastic yearbook called «Διπτυχα» (*Diptychs*).

The word, derived from the classical tradition, entered the christian world according several meanings, especially liturgical (see Appendix, page 11).

In the Eucharistic celebrations, even today, the term **diptych** designates the act of putting the name of the Patriarch side by side with the name of the metropolitan or of the local bishop, both mentioned during the Eucharistic anaphora. Actually, this aid, published every year by the orthodox Church (see *The Diptychs of the Church in Greece*, ed. Αποστολική Διακονία, Athens 2014, in Greek), is used for various necessities, inspired to the customs of the ancient church.

In the first place, it contains a **liturgical Calendar**, with rubrics and notes on the Saints and the feasts of the liturgical year.

In second place, it furnishes an **organization chart** of today orthodox Church in Greece. In particular: *a)* starting with the archbishopric of Athens, it lists all the 80 metropolies of the orthodox Church in Greece; *b)* it lists **all the churches** with dedication and qualification (feast or Saint) with the name of the parish priest or the priest who serves it (otherwise it is declared “vacant”, κενή); *c)* it lists sanctuaries and chapels; *d)* it mentions male and female monasteries, with the name of the higoùmenos (ο higoumèni), number of monks or nuns, telephon; *e)* the picture is completed by the detailed references to charitable, liturgical, iconographic, catechetical activities of the metropolitan church.

In third place, this book of the Diptychs gives a picture of the **autocephalous orthodox churches** of all the world, with a special attention to the Ecumenical Patriarchate and the territories and institutions under its jurisdiction.

The **redaction of the Diptychs** is entrusted to a Commission designated by the Holy Synod of the Greek Orthodox Church. It is composed by three metropolitans, three laymen, a secretary and some experts in liturgy and ecclesiastical organization. It is published by the “**Apostolic Diaconia**” (*Apostolikè Diakonia*, Αποστολική Διακονία), an institution directly depending upon the Holy Synod, with formation and information tasks as well as missionaries engagements.

Because of their official value, from these Diptychs we have taken the major information about St Nicholas churches and monasteries in Greece.

We have also taken into account the well known international site <http://www.stnicholascenter.org>, that, with its 192 churches supplied by photos, helped us to recuperate some 100 little churches not official registered in the Diptychs, but not deprived of artistic or touristic interest.

From the scrupulous inventory by D. Kamaroùlias (**The monasteries of Epirus**, 2 voll., Ed. Bastas, Athens 1996, in Greek) we have taken even those not listed in the Diptychs and of which today remain only ruins. Useful has been also the **Monasteries and sanctuaries of the Greek Church**, 3 voll., Ed. Nèos Diavlos, Athens 2003 (in Greek). For the churches and monasteries of Arcadia good sources have been the pages (*selides*) of the late our friend Captain **Nikos Kostaràs** (<http://nikos-kostaras.blogspot.it>), while for those of the Peloponnesus we have visited the sites of the metropolis of Elias: [<http://www.imiliias.gr>]. Equally we have consulted those of Kastorià province (<http://www.kastoriacity.gr>; and of Western Macedonia with the municipality of Siatista <http://www.siatistaagiosnikolaos.gr>. An interesting list of 352 churches throughout the island of Santorini is to be found in [http://santokoraki.blogspot.it/2013/03/blog-post_21.html] that refers to news documented in the volume by Michael I. Danesis [M.I. DANESIS, *Santorini, Thirò, Thirasià, Asprònisi, Efèstia, Ad.Pergamos*, 2001 (in Greek)].

For the few **Catholic churches** and chapels we refer to the pocket Calendar published yearly by catholic editors (**Eortologion 2014**, Athens, ed. «Καλός Τύπος», 2014 (in Greek) www.elcate.com); we are grateful to fr. **Markos Foskolos**, catholic parish priest of St Nicholas church in **Tinos**, for the information on the St Nicholas churches of the island as well as on the areas of “expertise” attributed to our Saint by the people of the island [see *Appendix*, page 11].

CHURCHES, CHAPELS, MONASTERIES AND METOCHIA

In giving the list that follows, we have to make some clarifications. It deals with the entire Greek geographical country, independently from the churchly jurisdiction (Orthodox, Catholic, Ecumenical Patriarchate, etc). The buildings dedicated to St Nicholas are mainly churches, inside or outside a city, designated with the ecclesiastical term of “**naòs**” (*temple*), where a normal liturgical life is observed.

The **chapels** (in Greek «**parecclisia**», *almost-churches*) are simple constructions inside or, more often, outside (in this case «**exocclisia**») towns or cities, that lack an ordinary liturgical life, with the exception of the feast of the dedication. All the **chapels** located **inside** a church or a monastery are **excluded**.

When we add “hospital”, “barracks”, “school” or “cemetery” we do it in order to clarify the institution to which they belong. The adjective “parochial” or “metropolitan” denote the jurisdiction upon which depend the chapel. If no qualification is given, does mean that we deal with private chapels very much spread throughout all Greece.

The term **metòchion**, means that the building or chapel is a “**dependence**” (*in Greek «μετόχιον»*) of a monastery. The word **Katholikòn** refers to the central church, where all the community (**καθ' ὅλον**) gathers in prayer and for the celebration of Eucharist. More private character have little or

devotional chapels located in the same monastery. If we write only *Katholikòn*, does mean that today exists only that central church.

Really impressive, both for number and geographical density, is the galaxy of churches, chapels and monasteries throughout the Greek territory. You can find them in the ravines of a mountain, or on sea rocks, in the edges of the roads as well at the center of a city, in cemeteries or in hospitals. In almost all the Peloponnesus and in the Ionian islands the Saint is celebrated twice a year, the **6 of December (liturgical feast)** and **May 9/10** in memory of his passage or **transit** (**πάροδος**) of his rests from Myra to Bari.

This St Nicholas geography of the Hellenic territory shows that Saint Nicholas is really **the most venerated Saint in Greece**. He is present in all the churches, wherever there are children or aged people who invoke the name of God and venerate the great father Nicholas.

My research, fitting in this wide range of St Nicholas cult in the world, wants to be my tribute of love and gratitude for the Church, the Country and the marvelous People of Greece.



